

SOLID WASTE INFORMATION

DEFINITIONS

BULK WASTE: Mattresses and box springs, stoves, hot water heaters, washing machines, furniture, and other similar items. Construction debris, refrigerators, air conditioners, dead animals, hazardous waste or similar matter **are not acceptable**.

CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS: Waste building materials resulting from construction, remodeling, repair or demolition operations.

APPROVED CONTAINER: A 90-gallon residential container provided by the Hauler. If you need a new container, call City Hall at 423-842-2533.

DEAD ANIMALS: Animals or portions thereof equal to or greater than ten (10) pounds in weight that have expired from any cause, except those slaughtered or killed for human consumption.

GARBAGE/RESIDENTIAL HOUSEHOLD WASTE: shall mean garbage, refuse and other discarded solid materials generated by residential sources within the City of Lakesite but not including hazardous waste as defined by regulations or law, or material derived from sewage or septage. All residential waste shall be appropriately bagged within the container.

HAZARDOUS WASTE: Any chemical, compound, mixture, substance or article which is designated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency or appropriate agency of the State to be “hazardous” as that term is defined by or pursuant to Federal or State law or regulations.

COMMERICAL ENTITY: A business entity within the Service Area.

PRODUCER: An occupant of a Residential Unit within the Service Area who generates waste.

REFUSE: This term shall refer to Garbage/Residential Household Waste and rubbish generated at a Residential Unit or Commercial Entity unless the context otherwise requires.

RESIDENTIAL UNIT: A dwelling within the Service Area as hereinafter defined, occupied by a person or group of persons. A Residential Unit shall be deemed occupied when water services, either public or private, are being supplied thereto. Each unit of an apartment or condominium dwelling consisting of four (4) or less living units, whether of single or multi-level construction, shall be treated as a Residential Unit. On any one collection day, the Hauler will collect from each Residential Unit all garbage and trash in approved containers.

YARD WASTE: All yard waste consisting of limbs and branches having diameter not greater than four (4) inches and a length not greater than four (4) feet **shall be tied in bundles**. Contractor shall not be obligated to collect any branches or limbs having a diameter greater than four (4) inches or a length greater than four (4) feet. All yard waste consisting of grass cuttings and leaves shall be placed in bags and tied. Contractor shall not be obligated to collect any yard waste not prepared for collection in the foregoing manner. Bundles shall not exceed thirty-five (35) pounds per bundle. Bagged leaves and grass shall not exceed thirty-five (35) pounds per bag.

SERVICE

The services to be provided by the hauler hereunder shall be for the twice a week curbside collection and disposal of all Garbage/Residential Household Waste generated by the Residential Units in the Service Area, limited to **one (1) can per Residential Unit**. Additional cans can be supplied to a residence at an additional monthly can rate then in effect BY THE WASTE HAULER.

The Hauler will also provide collection and disposal service on an alternate once weekly basis for

Bulky Waste and Yard Waste. **This information may be found on the attached calendar.**

Should any receptacle break or any other spillage occur during the transfer, the hauler must clean the area immediately.

Garbage placed for collection shall be stored in Approved Containers, as described herein. The Hauler shall not be required to collect Garbage/Residential Household Waste unless it is in approved containers.

Hazardous Wastes, refrigerators, ac units, body wastes, abandoned vehicles, vehicle parts, **construction debris**, large equipment and parts, and dead animals **will not be collected** by the Hauler under the terms of this Contract.

Any deviations to the above will be posted on the City Facebook Page, the City Website and Twitter.

When the Hauler has a holiday and it falls on a Monday or Thursday, the trash will be picked up on the next business day.

There are times where the Hauler will “fall behind” in their schedule. The cooperation and understanding of the residents is appreciated at this time.
